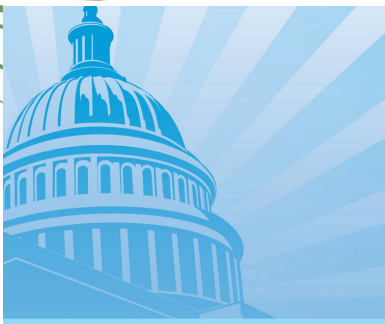

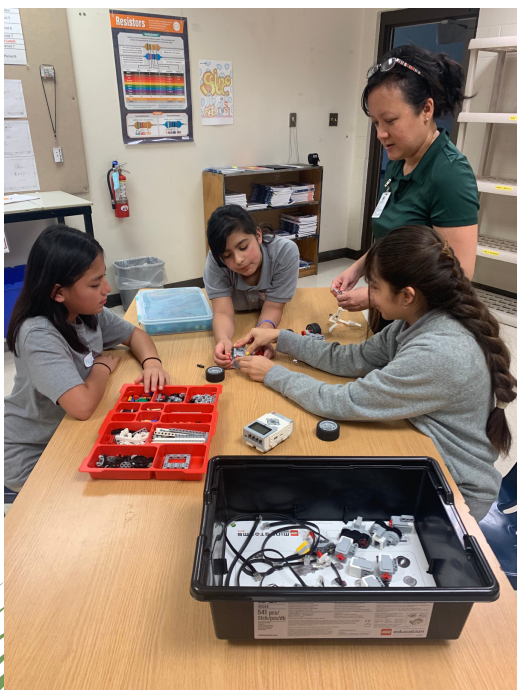


From D.C. to El Paso
